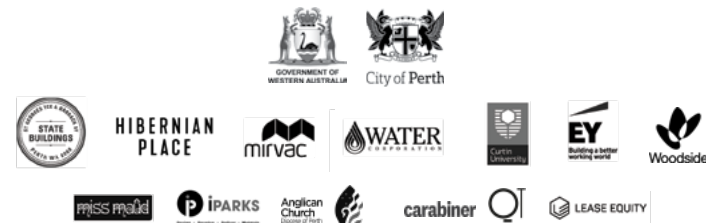

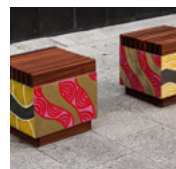

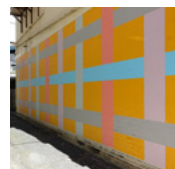
11. Peter Farmer for Historic Heart (2017), 572-578 and 524, Hay Street

Artist: Peter Farmer
 Peter's work helps understand the deep connectedness his people have to the environment.



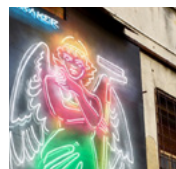
12. Peter Farmer Jnr for Historic Heart (2017), 500 Hay Street

 Peter believes "art can bring communities together to learn and communicate stories, like we did in traditional times".



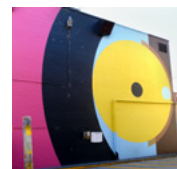
13. Mural Artworks 2 & 3 for Historic Heart (2017), Pier Street Laneway

 Straker's unique murals appear to light up like neon signs, and are created using spray paint and a 'neon glow' technique.



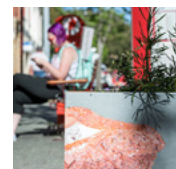
15. Mural Artwork 1 for Historic Heart (2017), 37 Pier Street

RUAH offers support across areas of homelessness, mental health and wellness, and domestic violence and justice.



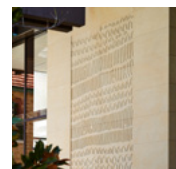
19. Jurek Wybraniec for Historic Heart (2017), 76 Murray Street

 Alex has widely exhibited his work nationally and internationally, and has a long-standing commitment to teaching art in the tertiary sector.



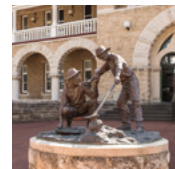
21. Westin Hotel (2018), Hibernian Lane, Westin Hotel entrance, adjacent to 480 Hay Street

 This sculpture depicts Arthur Bayley and William Ford, the two gold prospectors whose discovery 120 years ago in Coolgardie triggered the greatest gold rush in WA history.

A curated art walk for Perth's East End


Art for your city's heart

There is a diverse range of public art to enjoy in Perth's east end – from Marcus Canning's striking Ascalon at Cathedral Square to the beautiful large scale mural by Rone at Hibernian Place.

Take the time to roam the streets of Perth's east end. The art of the Historic Heart is waiting to be discovered.

Historic Heart of Perth Inc's first art project saw 65 planter boxes and benches installed across Perth's east end, from Barrack Street to Irwin Street. This is a patina of what is West Australian, with the planter boxes painted by West Australian artists and planted with native plants.

The art project was intended to signify new energy and change in the east end. The painted surfaces of the planter boxes and benches act as street level visual activation. Clustering the planter boxes into groups for particular artists ensures a rhythmic pattern of visuals that creates meaningful sight-lines or art pathways within the Historic Heart neighbourhood.

1. Kangaroos on the Terrace (1997), Cnr Barrack Street and St George's Terrace

Artist: Joan Walsh-Smith and Charles Smith

This artwork gives visitors a reason to pause and consider the contrasting busyness of the city with the peacefulness of Stirling Gardens.



6. Caspar Fairhall for Historic Heart (2017), Equus Arcade entrance, 580 Hay Street

Artist: Caspar Fairhall

This artwork can be seen as asking questions of the viewer such as: What does it mean to represent space in an image.



2. Ascalon (2011), Cathedral Square

Artists: Marcus Canning and Christian de Vietri

Depicting the triumph of good over evil, the angled pole and white billow represents St George's lance, cloak and steed, and its base the defeated body of the dragon.



7. Jo Darbyshire for Historic Heart (2017), Cathedral Avenue

Artist: Jo Darbyshire

Jo is a visual artist based in Fremantle, uses colour and motifs to celebrate and reflect a sense of place.



3. Point Zero (1975), 1 Cathedral Square (Cnr St Georges Terrace)

Point Zero is the marker from which all distances to and from Perth are measured, and represents the centre point and civic heart of the city.



8. Captain James Stirling (1979), City of Perth Library, 573 Hay Street

Artist: Clement P Somers

This statue of Captain James Stirling (1791 - 1865) was created in 1979 to celebrate Western Australia's 150th anniversary.



4. Dirty Deeds (2015), Petition Kitchen, Barrack Street

Artists: Marcus Canning and Tom Müller

This artwork illustrates where the two holding cells for the Police Court used to stand and the kind of people who spent time there.



9. Clare McFarlane for Historic Heart (2017), 93-99 Hay Street

Artist: Clare McFarlane

Clare combines lyrical Pre-Raphaelite patterning with the detailed depiction of birds, butterflies, insects and plants native to Australia.



5. Iconic (2015)

Artist: Matthew Harding

The iconic entrance sculpture for the Mirvac office tower is symbolic of the tree that was felled near this site in 1829 to commemorate the Foundation of Perth.



10. James Giddy for Historic Heart (2017), Murray Street

Artist: James Giddy

James's work is often inspired by environmental conservation drawing inspiration from people, landscape and the natural world.
